National Conference on Supply Chain Model for 'NO CHILD LABOUR' in Home based craft sector in India



Fair Trade Forum-India, in association with Traidcraft Exchange and Centre for education and Communication organised a National Conference on Supply Chain Model for 'NO CHILD LABOUR' in Home Based Craft Sector on 8<sup>th</sup> Dec 2014 at India Habitat Centre, New Delhi to disseminate the project outcomes and best practices and a cultural event on 9<sup>th</sup> Dec 2014 at Gandhi Smriti, Rajghat, New Delhi.

The Conference was an overwhelming success, attracting 130 delegates and speakers from all over India including Government, EU Delegation in India, Corporates, Fair Trade organisations, Educational institutions and NGOs, and provided great intellectual and social interaction for the participants.





The five vital components of the project model were taken up in the sessions-*Wages & Social Security; Public Provisioning; Supply Chain Management; Awareness & Participation; Education and Schooling.* Each session had a presenter on which experts gave their views, suggestions and ideas on each of the project model components. The discussions focussed on the importance of bridge schools, supply chain, social security, wages and need for separate laws to tackle child labour in home based craft sector.

On this occasion **Sh Navraj Goyal, Additional Development Commissioner (Handicrafts), Ministry of Textiles, Government of India**, offered his full support to this initiative and felt that this sort of initiatives are required to address child labour issue in the craft sector across the country.

## Nagalakshmi from Blue Mango Trust Shares her Story



Nagalakshmi is a bead worker in Blue Mango Trust, Tamil Nadu, MESH's best supplier. Just opposite the entrance road to Blue Mango is a residential center for people with disabilities called RUADT, where Nagalakshmi lives.

Nagalakshmi shares a little about her life:

"I had polio as a baby and if I walk for more than 10 minutes my back hurts me so much that I have to stop. I studied until 9th grade and I dropped out after failing my math examinations. I stayed with my parents for a while and became very depressed. I couldn't leave the house without help so I just sat there and didn't do anything. For a change, I moved into my brother's house to take care of his new baby. Living there was unpleasant because my brother and his wife fought all the time. I finally decided that I needed to live in RUADT and find some work. I came to Blue Mango in 2005.

I don't have any dreams for the future. Whenever I go home I bring my parents some money to support them. I have earned enough money to buy myself some gold jewelry. It's the first jewelry I have ever owned and I'm proud of having earned it myself. The women here are helpful. It's a good atmosphere."

Melody and Robert visited FTF-I and its members during their internship in the month of December 2014. hey visited organisations-TARA Projects, Usha Exim, MESH, Kala Aparajita, FTCI, Conserve and Himalaya Tailoring Centre. They were encouraged to meet and discuss the Fair Trade lives of grassroot artisans and producers. They also visited few FAIR TRADE INDIA shops to know about the Fair Trade domestic market reach.

They shared their Fair Trade travelogues with FTF-I team. They were impressed with the wonderful variety of goods from all the different producers, and enjoyed seeing the huge variety of Indian handicrafts from around the nation. They both observed the attention to quality, and consider Fair Trade products to be consistently better quality than their commercial counterparts.

They also visited Women in India exhibition in Delhi Haat in which nineteen Fair Trade organizations participated. At Delhi Haat they saw the way that the women in India expo provided a platform for Fair Trade members to promote their goods alongside commercial markets. It seemed that Delhi haat was a very good way to introduce the younger generation to the market context and teach them the way that Fair Trade stands out against competitors, why price and quality are important etc.
